STEM with NPASS (National Partnership for Afterschool Science)

The NPASS program is designed to equip staff with a hands-on STEM curriculum and the confidence and competencies to deliver high quality inquiry based STEM learning for children and youth.



PROMOTING CIVIC ENGAGEMENT IN THE OST FIELD MAY 9-10, 2016

Last year, we celebrated 11 years of traveling to Sacramento to advocate for children and youth. Our annual CA Afterschool & Summer Challenge event has empowered communities from across California to share their stories of why afterschool and summer programming for youth matters. Over the years we have averaged 250 attendees annually from diverse parts of the state. Bringing together communities, some of whom are isolated through the year, creates magic. Our empowered participants, ranging in age from 5 to 95, begin to feel part of something larger; a collective voice for out-of-school time.
