New Lesson Plans

- Surprises vs. Secrets
 - » Differentiate between a surprise & a secret
 - » Identify trusted adults to whom they can reveal a secret
- Uncomfortable Touch
 - » Identify situations where they would express discomfort to an adult
 - » Practice saying "no"

- Provide impactful safety programming

- Expanded learning programs serve vulnerable youth
- More direct touchpoint with families
- ELP staff members are credible messengers



Santa Maria-Bonita Unified School District Pilot

- March 2018 May 2018
- 20 elementary afterschool sites
- 6-week KidSmartz club involving
- Trained and supported facilitators at 17 afterschool sites in Santa Maria-Bonita Unified School District
- Facilitators reported lessons were engaging, easy to use, and well-planned
- 1,300+ students





Los Angeles County KidSmartz Pilot

- October 2018 December 2018
- 20 elementary sites
- 8 lessons (taught twice per week)
- Facilitator Training:
 - » 3 hour KidSmartz in-person training on October 15th or 17th for Site Coordinator + front line staff
 - » 2 hour child abuse prevention online training Darkness 2 Light Stewards of Children
- Weekly 30 minute check-in
- Pre & post surveys
- Focus groups
- Train-the-Trainer program
- Applications are due September 28th
