4. Program Funding

A. 21ST CCLC FUNDING : <u>House</u> appropriators propose substantial increase to 21st Century Community Learning Centers afterschool funding.

The House Labor, Health and Human Services, Education (LHHS) Appropriations and Related Agencies Subcommittee marked up their FY2020 spending measure on Tuesday, April 30, showing strong support for education programs including a record funding level for federal afterschool support. The FY2020 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education (LHHS) and Related Agencies Appropriations Act increases spending by 6 percent (about \$11 billion) and sets funding levels for all federal education, human services, and health and labor programs.

Among those programs is the <u>21st Century</u> <u>Community Learning Centers</u> initiative, which provides federal funds leveraged by local school-community partnerships to provide quality afterschool and summer learning programs to 1.7
