11. Staffing requirements	Must minimally meet district Instructional Aide requirements which vary but often require a minimum of two years of college	Varies according to licensure agreements.
12. Quality Standards	After School Division of CA Department of Education has issued Quality Standards for Expanded Learning Programs	There are no standards that are applicable to all programs in this category.
13. Coordination/Alignment with the Instructional Day	Programs partner with instructional day so there is coordination with instruction being provided and programs operate under district policies and procedures	There are no requirements that this type of coordination exist.
