# **AB699 Implementation Workgroup**

LACOE participates on the Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations Workgroup related to implementation of AB 699. This legislation provides protection to immigrant students, including providing training for districts on bullying due to immigrant status. Discrimination is prohibited based on a student's immigration status. School districts must adopt or amend their current policies to prohibit discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on a student's actual or perceived immigration status. Districts must a have a process in place to receive and investigate complaints for discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on protected characteristics.
